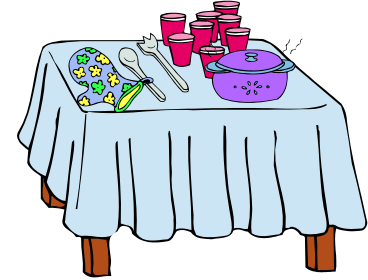


How Many Napkins On the Table?

Print the mat (pg. 2) and number cards onto cardstock and laminate for durability.

VERSION 1 (easier)

- *Place some napkins on the mat (pg. 2).
- *Ask your child to count the number of napkins.
- *Help him locate the number (from the number cards, pg. 4)

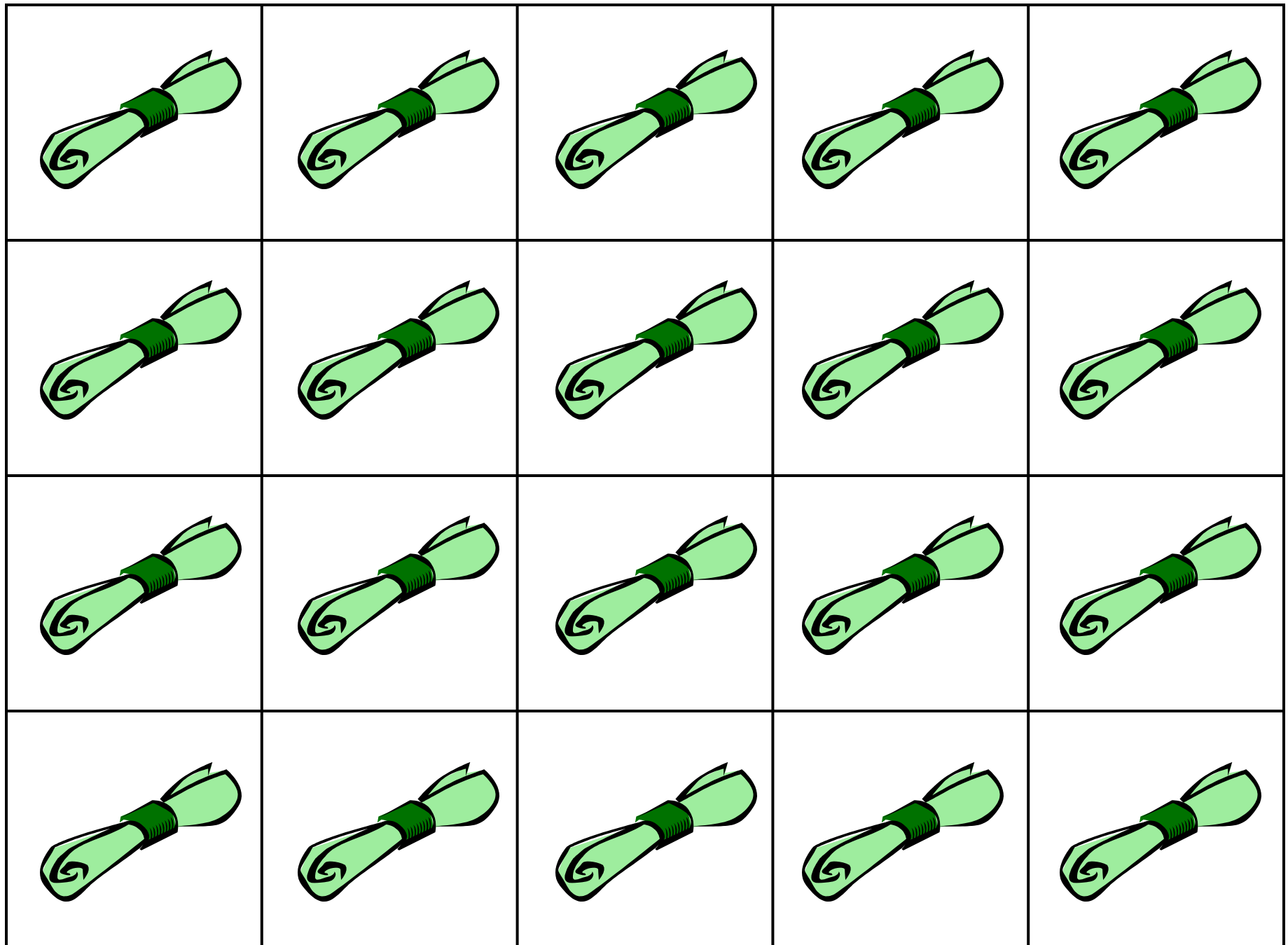


VERSION 2 (harder)

- *Place some napkins on the mat (pg.2)
- *Ask your child to count the number of napkins.
- *Help him locate and trace the correct number (with the number tracer cards, pp. 5-6)

VERSION 3 (hardest)

- *Pose it as a problem to the child, such as "You put out 4 napkins on the table. Then dad told you to put out 1 more. How many napkins do you have now?"
- *The child uses the napkins on pg. 3 to solve the problem (assist or model this, if child needs help).
- *The child locates the number (from pg. 4) or locates AND traces the number (with the number tracer cards, pp. 5-6)



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Number Tracing Cards 1-20

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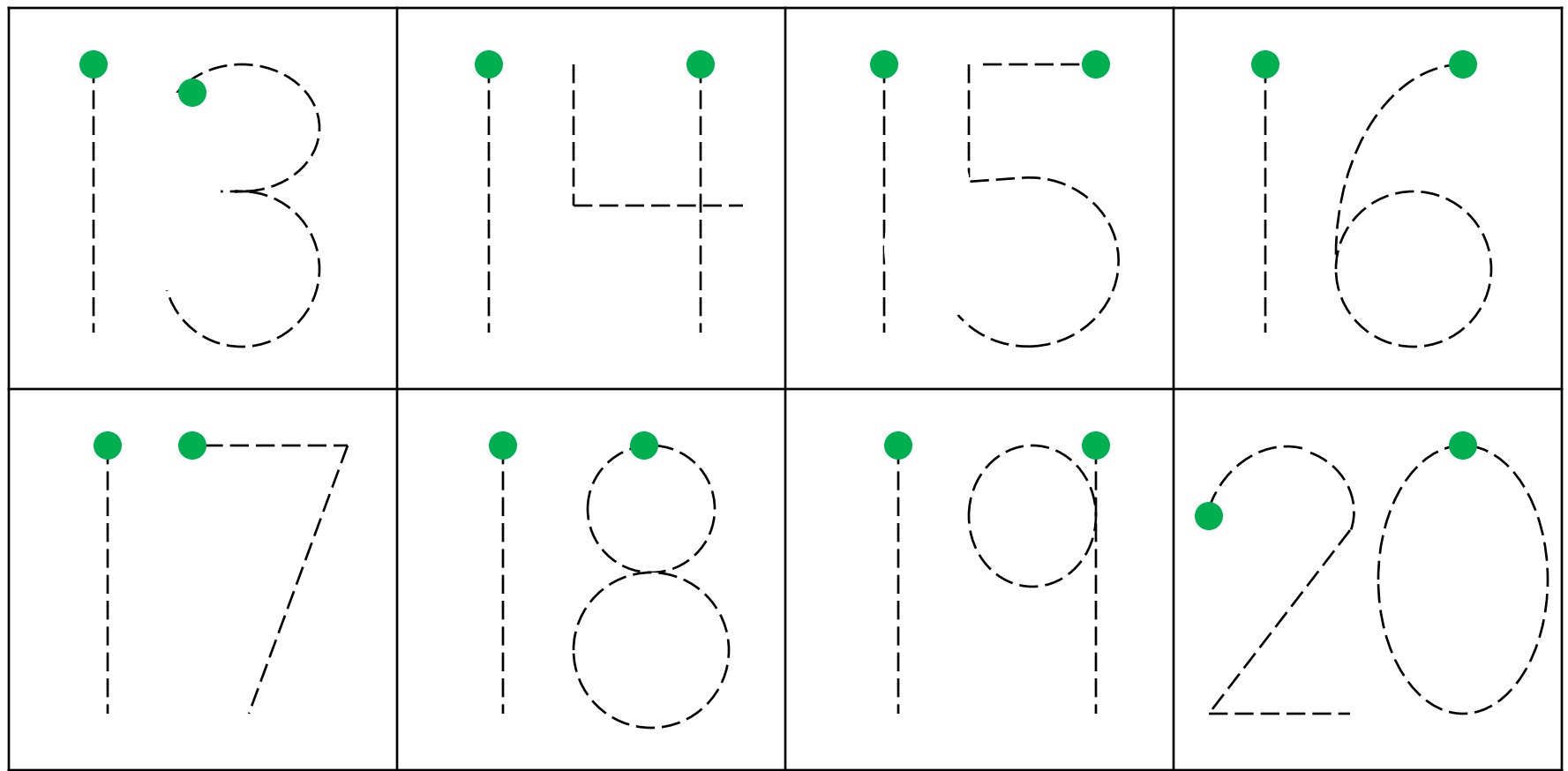
