

Long o Word Family Sort

Unit 2, Lesson 3: The God of Hope

Directions for introducing the sort:

- Cut apart the words ahead of time (or your child can do this).
- Set up *nose*, *rope*, *bone* & *woke* as your headers: the other words will go in columns underneath (see below). Don't worry with the oddball at this time.
- Sort all the words first by their visual patterns.
- Read through the words together (*it is important that all of these words are familiar to your child*). Discuss any words that your child doesn't know the meaning of, such as *slope*, *throne*, or *zone*.
- Introduce the oddball category and help your child locate the oddball-one (because it doesn't make the long o sound)
- Scramble up the words and let her sort again with support.

Your sort should look like this when complete:

nose	rope	bone	woke	oddball
those	hope	throne	joke	one
hose	slope	zone	choke	
rose	mope	phone	spoke	
close	cope		broke
